Flower: CREAM in Early Summer

Light: PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** WELL DRAINED **Height:** 20 cm

Attractive 3-part fan-shaped leaves have a sweet vanilla scent when dried. Excellent ground cover plant for shady woodland areas. (Family: Berberidaceae; Native to: Western N. America)

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** AVERAGE **Height:** 150 cm

A twining Monkshood native to Korea, Russia and China growing in forests and in scrub. Basal rosettes of large, sturdy, lobed foliage out of which grow twining stems cloaked with tall, narrow violet hoods with white lower petals (Limited Availability) (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: Russia)

Dark, purple-blue glossy in long dense, branching spike. Leaves are a glossy, dark green, narrowly divided. (Limited Availability) (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

The underside of the deep blue-green leaves have long silky hairs that give a silver edge to leaf. This is found growing from Greenland and northern Europe south to the Pyrenees and Alps, in screes, stony slopes, rock crevices and grassland, in the sun. (Limited Availability) (Family: Rosaceae; Native to: Eurasia)

An excellent inhabitant for open woodlands making a carpet of 10-15" tall, arching stems bearing ivory white flowers. Try combining them with botanical bulbs such as grape hyacinths, Siberian squill. (Limited Availability) (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Above a pair of 3-lobed leaves appears the fascinating flower. The drooping spathe, the pulpit, can be solid green to green with purple stripes and the spadix, Jack, is usually dark purple. Later in the summer, the flower is replaced by a black seed cluster that turns a rich red by autumn. (Family: Araceae; Native to: Eastern N. America)

The slim, deep green fronds are unusually crisscrossed and come to a narrow point that terminates with a small crest that grows through the season. It brings elegance to any shaded or morning sun location in rich soils. The red petioles contrast nicely with the apple green foliage. The result is a clump-forming rigidly upright large fern with the habit of lady fern but the silver colouration of the Japanese painted fern including red stalks. Dan Hinkley, in his fine book, The Explorer's Garden, calls this the most beautiful of the many species he grows. <p>Flower: BLUE-PURPLE in Late Summer Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 70 cm</p> <p>A heracleifolia type with purple stems bearing clusters of tubular purple flowers which later open and spread. The inside of the tepals is darker than the outside. This cultivar was raised at the Proefstation voor de Boomkwekerij in Boskoop, Holland from seeds collected in China. The scented, clear lavender-blue, hyacinth like, 1.5" (3.5cm) flowers, are produced in late July through September. Mature height 3' (1m). Prune to within a few inches of the ground in late winter. This cultivar originates from a seedling in John Fopma's clematis collection and is named for Ria Stockmann. Non-climbing. Prune to the ground in late winter. 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Clematis recta Serious Black NEW! Flower: FRAGRANT CREAM CLUSTERS in Late Spring Light: FULL SUN Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 150 cm Upright herbaceous clematis with glossy purple foliage in the spring and many masses of white flowers blooming atop 3' clumps of olive green foliage in summer. After flowering, new foliage is dark purple again, and compared to Clematis 'Purpurea', this cultivar blooms more profusely. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.) Opens very flat. Once established will rebloom during summer. A C. (fauriei x alpina ssp sibirica) x macropetala hybrid bred by Stanley Zubrowski in Saskatchewan, Canada. No pruning necessary. Stamens dark violet at first, white at base later. This variety was awarded a bronze medal at Plantarium 2004 in Boskoop. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.) Clematis x Sweet Summer Love NEW! Flower: CRANBERRY-PURPLE FRAGRANT in Mid-Summer Light: FULL SUN Soil: MOIST Height: 200 cm Beginning to flower in July with clusters of richly coloured and fragrant flowers, this clematis should be planted in a spot where you can enjoy the fragrance. Developed by Clematis breeder Szczepan Marczynski of Poland. Prune back in early spring. As with all clematis, it may take a couple of seasons for it to really take off. It needs to get its roots deeply into the ground. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)	Clematis Sweet Summer Love (13cm Deep Pot) \$27.00
Clematis x fargesiodes (Paul Farges) Flower: CREAM in Mid to Late Summer Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 300 cm A cross between C. fargesii and C. vitalba. Fragrant, silver dollar-sized flowers on a vigorous vine. Prune in very early spring. It is also know by 'Paul Farges', which preserves the original reference to the French missionary and explorer who bore that name. No Pruning necessary. Clematis x integrifolia Arabella Flower: PURPLE BLUE in Summer to Frost Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 150 cm Purple-blue flowers with prominent cream anthers. Very free-flowering over a long period. Ideal for growing through small shrubs. A hybrid of C. integrifolia raised by Barry Fretwell and introduced in 1990. Prune to the ground in very early spring. Clematis x integrifolia Inspiration Flower: DARK PINK in Summer to Frost Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 200 cm This free-flowering herbaceous variety has medium-sized flowers dark pink in colour with yellow stamens with a long flowering period. Compact habit. Looks like a pink form of C. x Durnadii. Prune to ground in very early spring. (C. integrifolia 'Rosea' x C. 'Warsaw Nike') (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.) Clematis x integrifolia Pamjat Serdsta Flower: PURPLE in Early Summer to Fall Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 120 cm The name translates as "memory of the heart". Long blooming and satin sheened, the rich colored heliotrope purple blooms show off darker, glossier midribs. Developed at the Ukraine's Nikita Botanic Garden. Prune to the ground in late winter, early spring. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)	Clematis Pamjat Serdsta (13cm Deep Pot) \$21.00
Clematis x integrifolia Roguchi Flower: BLUE-PURPLE NODDING in Summer to Frost Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 200 cm With bells to 5 cm (2 inches) long (especially on the earliest flowers), and strong ridging on thick sepals, somehow deepening the color and intensifying the luster of the integrifolia parent. Pale borders accentuate the four sepals, which are the blue of Italian plums. Prune to ground in late winter. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)	Clematis Roguchi (13cm Deep Pot) \$18.00
Clematis x jouniana Chance Flower: PALE MAUVE in Late Summer Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: WELL DRAINED Height: 250 cm Small white flowers with a bluish tinge, lightly scented. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)	(13cm Deep Pot) \$26.00

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Clematis x koreana Brunette

Flower: RUBY RED-CHOCOLATE in Early Summer to Fall

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 300 cm

Lightly scented, deep reddish purple flowers with a hint of brown and a satinlike sheen. The main flowering period is April-May but 'Brunette' continues to flower on new growth until August. A hybrid of *C. koreana* var. *fragrans* x *C. fauriei* raised by Magnus Johnson in 1979. Excellent as a ground cover or scrambling through a low shrub. No pruning necessary. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Clematis x viticella Etoile Violette

Flower: DEEP PURPLE in Mid-Summer

(12cm Deep Pot) \$17.00

Light: FULL SUN **Soil:** WELL DRAINED **Height:** 300 cm

10 to 13 cm wide, deep purple flowers are produced in profusion. Creamy yellow stamens. Raised by Morel of Lyon in 1885, a very free-flowering cultivar. Prune to ground in early spring. (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Clematis x viticella Purpurea Plena Elegans

Flower: PLUM-RED in Mid-Summer

(12cm Deep Pot) \$17.00

Light: FULL SUN **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 200 cm

A 6cm wide cluster of narrow sepals recurved in the manner of a reflexed chrysanthemum make this unique among the viticellas. As the flowers are sterile they last a long time on the plant. Vigorous and free flowering. Prune to the ground in late winter. (AGM/RHS) (Family: Ranunculaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Cornus canadensis

Flower: PURE WHITE in Late Spring

(13cm Short Pot) \$12.00

Light: PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 5 cm

A tidy crisp plant with a single white bloom in early summer that becomes a bright red berry. Sometimes the foliage will turn a deep burgundy as the nights become cooler. Bunchberries make a wonderful groundcover and are very showy when planted in groups. They prefer a moist shady area but will tolerate more sun as long as the moisture is there. (Family: Cornaceae; Native to: North America)

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** WELL DRAINED **Height:** 15 cm

dainty woodland plants with glaucous fern-like leaves and longish, tubular flowers with tiny orchid-like tips; makes colorful mounds in the garden,

This is a rare form but once established in the garden multiplies nicely. Because of the heat this year they are now going dormant, which is the best time to plant the tubers. (AGM/RHS) (Limited Availability) (Family: Papaveraceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Bulblet Bladder Fern

Light: PARTIAL-FULL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 35 cm

Cystopteris bulbifera is a low-growing rock fern with creeping stems and narrow elongate deltate fronds. *C. bulbifera* is unusual among ferns in producing bulblets along the bottom of the fronds. This is one of the easiest *Cystopteris* species to identify. (Family: Woodsiaceae; Native to: Eastern N. America)

Dodecatheon dentatum

Flower: WHITE in Late Spring

White Shooting Star

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 20 cm

A delicate, dwarf shooting stars, the flowering stem rising only 6 in. above the rosette of crinkled, toothed, basal leaves. Open umbels of white flowers top the flowering stem. (Limited Availability) (Family: Primulaceae; Native to: Western N. America)

Dodecatheon meadia Aphrodite

Flower: VIOLET-PINK in Late Spring

(12cm Deep Pot) \$8.00

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 35 cm

Clusters of intense violet pink flowers, which smell faintly of grape juice, atop 30 cm tall stalks, in mid to late spring. (Family: Primulaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

Flower: LILAC in Late Spring

Lilac Shooting Star

Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE **Soil:** MOIST **Height:** 25 cm

Beautiful late spring perennial. Does best in a spot that is moisture during the spring. If the soil dries out a bit, later in the season the plant will go dormant. (Family: Primulaceae; Native to: Eastern N. America)

Flower: MAGENTA in Late Spring

Dwarf Shooting Star

basal clumps of leaves and nodding flowers that are produced at the top of tall stems that rise from where the leaves join the crown. (Family: Primulaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)

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Dodecatheon x media Aphrodite Flower: VIBRANT MAGENTA in Late Spring Light: SUN to PARTIAL SHADE Soil: MOIST Height: 30 cm Aphrodite has hybrid vigor and is taller, with a more robust appearance, than species dodecatheon. Flowers are much larger than the normal as well, blooming in a deep orchid-pink. As with most shootingstars they like moisture in the spring and once they go dormant it can be much drier. A stately selection with red-rimmed leaves in spring to about 14-16 inches high, 'Sweetheart' produces dark rose-red flowers held above as well as in among the leaves. This hybrid prostrate speedwell was selected from a cross made at the Chicago Botanic Garden in 2007 between *Veronica armena* and *Veronica pectinata* 'Rosea', two already popular prostrate speedwells. This selection seems to have inherited the best traits from both parents: it's denser and faster spreading than either parent, with small oaklike leaves that are medium green with a faint silvery-blue cast from its slight pubescence. (Family: Scrophulariaceae; Native to: GARDEN ORIG.)
